
ST. PAUL LOOP Part of the Virginia Coal Heritage Trail System




<u>Starting Point of St. Paul Loop</u>: At the intersection of 58A and 63 (Wise County) turn east on 58A at St. Paul (Russell County) towards Castlewood, south on Rt 65 Mew Road through the town of Mew (into Scott County) then south on Hwy 72 through Dungannon then left onto Rye Cove Road loop back to Hwy 72 to Fort Blackmore, Clinchport with side trip south on Hwy 23 to Copper Creek Railroad Trestle.

Then North on Hwy 23 through Duffield (into Lee County then into Wise County) past Big Stone Gap where road becomes Hwy 23/58A/Norton-Coeburn Hwy then splits. Turn east on Hwy 58A through Tacoma, turn onto Hwy 72 through Coeburn and Tom's Creek then back to Hwy 58A through Virginia City back to St. Paul.

Please note: A scenic loop (noted by the dotted **red** line) was considered which takes the traveler off VA 65 in Scott County onto Hwys 653 and 641 taking one past the tragic site of the tornado which destroyed the community of Rye Cove including the destruction of the schoolhouse killing a number of students as well as residents in the area. The old school bell is located in front of the new school as a tribute to those who perished.

But after further review, it was felt that a wayside exhibit at the intersection of VA 65 and Hwy 653 which could then note the monument. It would then be the choice of the traveler whether or not to travel the route to see the bell.

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This road connects with the Pocahontas Trail at St. Paul.

A formal request has been made on behalf of the Coeburn Town Council and the Coeburn Economic Development Authority to include communities of Coeburn and Tom's Creek be added to the Virginia Coal Heritage Trail as an extension on the St. Paul Loop.

The changes in the route (noted in **blue** on the map) would include:

- As one drives east on Hwy 58A from Tacoma towards St. Paul, take Exit 1 onto VA 72N/Downtown/VA158E for 0.3 miles, turn left on VA 813/2nd Street SW for 0.4 miles then right onto Front Street E/VA158 into the historic Town of Coeburn, home of Lays Hardware Center for the Arts.
- Instead of turning right onto Front Street, if one turned left onto Laurel Avenue/VA 72 for 1.6 miles then right onto Tom's Creek Road for 4.3 miles to "arrive at the site of an operational coal tipple where many coke ovens once existed". Tom's Creek was known by all the other surrounding coal camps as the Cultural Center for the region. Still remaining are two historic railroad structures.
