CHAPTER IV SNAPSHOT VIEW & HIGHLIGHTS Along the Virginia Coal Heritage Trail

In APPENDIX A is a snapshot view of the entire route divided into three sections; the Pocahontas to St. Paul Trail, the St. Paul Loop and the Norton Loop. All of this information was added to the Virginia Coal Heritage Byway initiative website along with photos of each of the sites to allow all involved or with an interest in the project to have easy access to the information.

Below is a page from the "mile by mile" inventory which shows what one will find on the first mile of the Norton Loop. From this inventory, recommendations were developed from observations made from driving the route. This inventory includes road descriptions, site information, preliminary recommendations, and points of interest visible from the road. It also points out areas of concern and reveals where byway signage is located as well as where more is needed and notes areas where additional signage is needed for safety

purposes.

This information was then shared with those attending the town meetings as a way to engage the general public in the discussions and actively involve them in the process without having to actually take them to a given site.

This "mile by mile" photo format has proven to be invaluable in allowing issues to be raised and concerns addressed. When one can visually see what it is being discussed, one can make better, more informed decisions as to the action to take. It will also serve as a way to monitor the progress of the trail as specific sections are addressed and improved.
